He trained in ballet with Nancy Bielsky, David Howard, Wilhelm Burmann, Fabrice Hauralt, Bonnie Mathis, Lirena Branitsky and Tatiana Berenova. He has performed several principal roles including the Nutcracker Prince, Sugarplum Cavalier, Arabian Prince, Snow Cavalier, Blue Bird Pas de Deux, Head Rancher in RODEO, Prince Florimund in SLEEPING BEAUTY, Fall Pas de Deux in CINDERELLA, Prince Siegfried in SWAN LAKE, Albrecht in GISELLE and the male lead in CAAM'S BUTTERFLY LOVERS choreographed by world renown Chinese Choreographer, Shen Pei. After graduating from The State Conservatory of Music in Lviv, he served from 1996 to 2000 as an Associate Conductor at The State Theatre of Opera and Ballet in Dnepropetrovsk, Ukraine, where he conducted productions including *The Marriage of Figaro, Rigoletto, La Traviata, Carmen, Pagliacci, Eugene Oneguine, Die Fledermaus, La Fille Mal Gardée, Giselle, Don Quixote, Swan Lake* and *Sleeping Beauty*.
